Boots on the Ground for Dogfight Victim

In January 2025, a severely injured pitbull-type dog was abandoned on the roadside after a brutal dogfight in Johannesburg South. He could not be saved. But we have not forgotten him. And we will not stop until those responsible are brought to justice.

Our Special Projects Unit is on the ground, actively tracking down the perpetrators. Recently, the team was in Diepkloof, speaking to the community, engaging with shop owners and pedestrians, and putting up posters in a desperate bid to gather information.
