

Despite logistical challenges, our dedicated Inspectors diligently navigated the absence of street names and house numbers, ensuring pets received essential care.

The NSPCA applauds the Judgment of the Eastern Cape Division of the High Court, Makhanda, for **affirming the NSPCA's mandate** in respect of shearing all animals bound for the Al Messilah Live Export vessel, that docked in the East London Harbour on 02 April 2024. The NSPCA has confirmed the presence of contagious ecthyma, an infectious dermatitis of sheep and goats, which is contagious to humans too, in the Al Mawashi Feedlot, contained in the herd bound for Kuwait and Saudi Arabia.
