When I first held young Tsebe, she felt fragile in my arms. Her head stayed low, eyes averted, tail tucked tightly beneath her, keeping as much of herself hidden as she could.

In moments like that, it is difficult to imagine what comes next. While they are still trembling in your arms, the idea of a different future feels very far away.

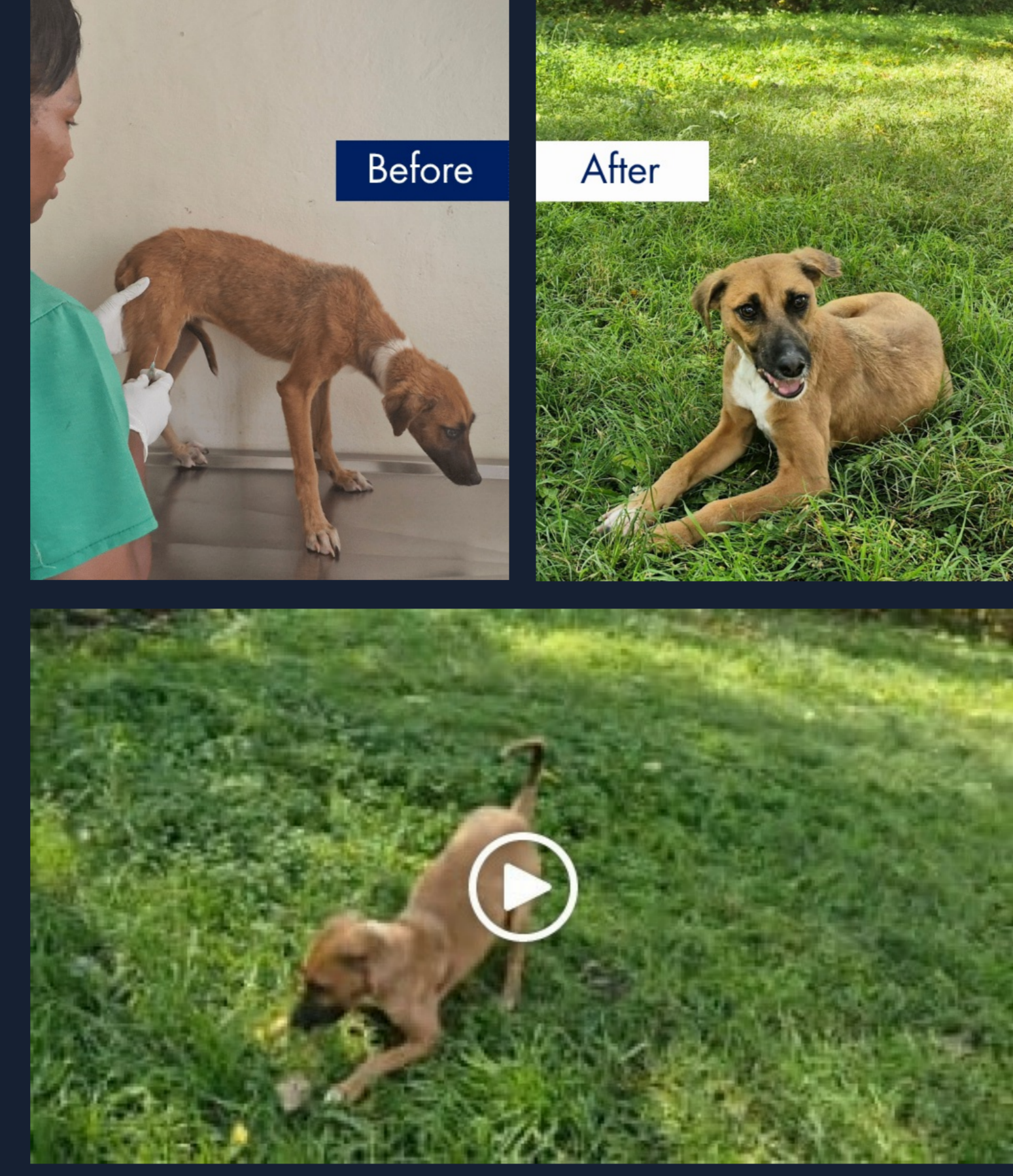
A week later, I saw her again at the Mafikeng SPCA.

She already seemed bigger somehow, more willing to take up space. Her eyes were bright with energy. She ran in loose circles across the grass, stopping only to change direction. It was the kind of freedom that only appears once survival is no longer an animal's only priority — the small wastefulness of play that starving dogs cannot afford.

Watching her like this, I felt proud. And yet, I still wished I could take away the life she had known before this one.

But for this moment at least, it was enough just to witness the beginning of something better.

In May, we were uncertain whether the well-being of wild animals would remain protected under South African law. In June, we are feeling cautiously hopeful.

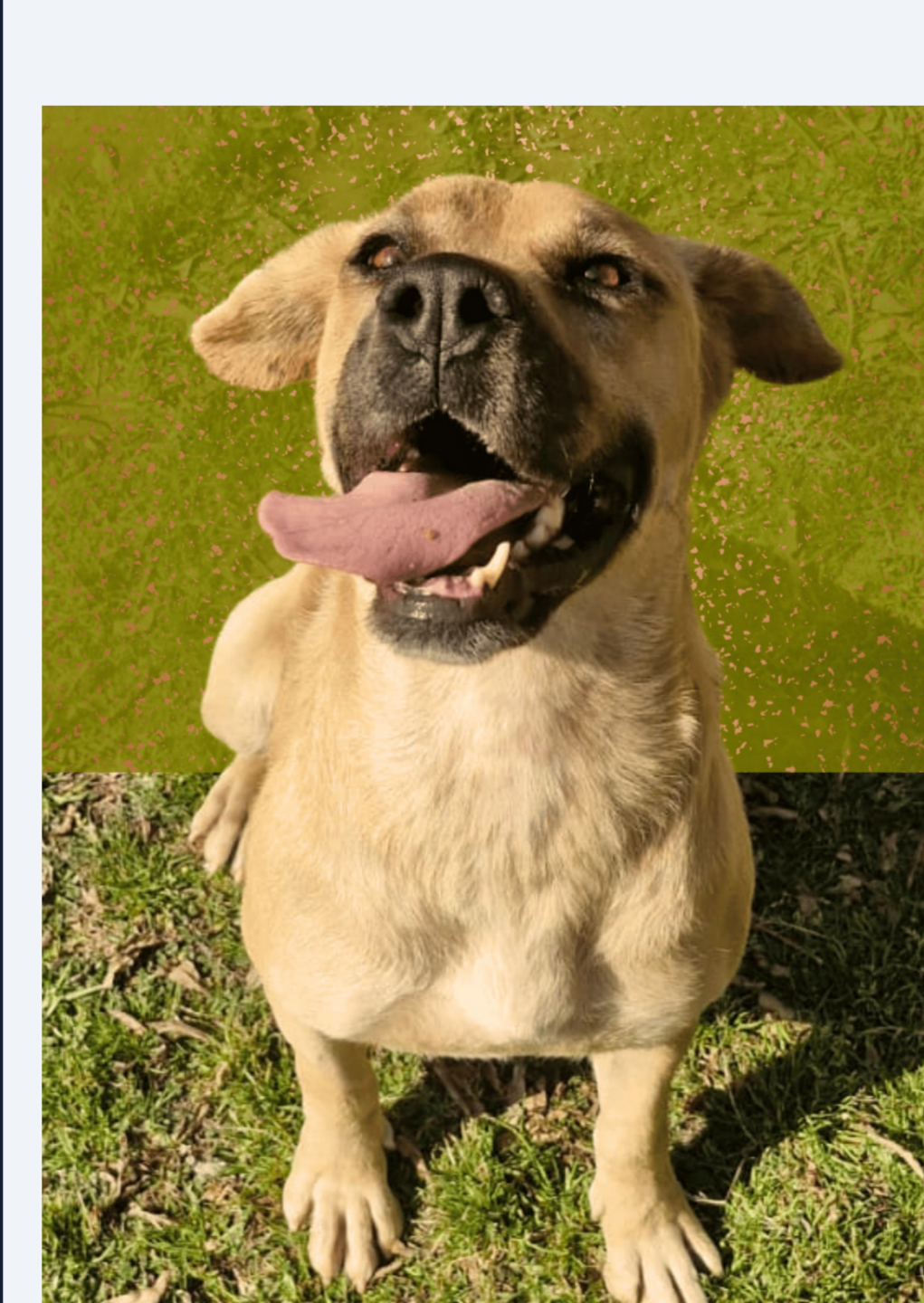
